Mayor Frank G. Jackson Scholarship Program 2016/2017

The Mayor Frank G. Jackson Scholarship Program was created by the City of Cleveland in 2007 for the purpose of providing scholarship funds to the following individuals:

- (1) City employees;
- (2) Dependents of City employees;
- (3) High school seniors graduating from the Cleveland Metropolitan School District; or involved with the City of Cleveland Department of Recreation.

Applicants must also submit:

- Most recent high school or college transcript
- 2 letters of recommendation
- 2016/2017 Student Aid Report

In addition to the required College Now materials, applicants also must submit an essay (maximum 500 words) answering one of the three following questions:

- If you were involved in Cleveland city government, what singular issue would you take the most interest in? What possible solutions would you propose to this issue? How do you see your talents impacting this issue and what would you do to bring about a positive change?
- With the 2016 Republican National Convention coming to the city of Cleveland this year, what impacts or benefits do you think it will have on the city as a whole?
- How would you encourage more people, particularly high school and college students, to become engaged in local civic activity?
