B-25 bombers to fly over Ohio to honor historic air raid

DAYTON, Ohio — Seventeen World War II B-25 bombers will fly over the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force in Ohio next month to mark the 75th anniversary of an air raid by the United States on Japan.

The Dayton Daily News reports the bombers are scheduled to rumble over the Dayton area on April 18. On that date 75 years ago, 80 airmen, known as the Doolittle Tokyo Raiders, took off from the deck of the USS Hornet to launch a critical strike on Tokyo.

Stars and Stripes March 29 is now National Vietnam War Veterans Day, thanks to a bill sponsored by Pennsylvania Sen. Pat Toomey and signed into law this week by President Trump. The measure, which was co-sponsored by Indiana Democratic Sen. Joe Donnelly, permanently designates the day for honoring Vietnam War veterans.

It's Official: March 29 Is National Vietnam War Veterans Day

(Washington, DC) – “Forty-two years ago today, the last American combat troops left the former South Vietnam, marking the end of what was then our nation’s longest war,” said John Rowan, National President of Vietnam Veterans of America. “And yesterday, the bipartisan legislation, S.305, authored by Senators Pat Toomey (R-Pa.) and Joe Donnelly (D-Ind.), permanently designating March 29th as National Vietnam War Veterans Day, was signed into law by President Trump.”

“*The Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017* is the first federal statute to recognize in perpetuity the bravery and sacrifice of veterans who served during the Vietnam War. Although this day may be bittersweet for some of us, and though we cannot claim that the United States emerged victorious from that terribly divisive war, we can look back with pride for the service we rendered in answering our nation’s call,” said Rowan.

The stigma that stops Veterans from getting help for PTSD

PBS (Video/Audio): The most important thing to remove the stigma from PTSD is for people to talk about it, but, in talking about it, not fall into the stereotypes. For people who have PTSD, they're at risk for depression, for substance abuse. They're at high risk for suicide, largely because of the nature of PTSD, to think about the world and yourself in negative terms, and this idea that nothing could ever go right.

Cleveland VA Highlighted in Healthcare Equality Index 2017

National Survey Names Louis Stokes Cleveland VA Medical Center "Leader in LGBTQ Healthcare Equality"

CLEVELAND – The Human Rights Campaign (HRC) Foundation recognized the Cleveland VA as a *"Leader in LGBTQ Healthcare Equality"*. HRC is the educational arm of the country's largest lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ) civil rights organization.

The findings were part of HRC Foundation's *Healthcare Equality Index 2017*, a unique annual survey that encourages equal care for LGBTQ Americans by evaluating inclusive policies and practices related to LGBTQ patients, visitors and employees.

“The Cleveland VA is committed to equitable, inclusive care for LGBTQ patients, and their families,” said Northeast Ohio VA Healthcare System Director Susan Fuehrer.

Cleveland VA is one of a select group of 302 healthcare facilities nationwide to be named *Leaders in LGBTQ Healthcare Equality*. Facilities awarded this title meet key criteria, including patient and employee non-discrimination policies that specifically mention sexual orientation and gender identity, a guarantee of equal visitation for same-sex partners and parents, and LGBTQ health education for key staff members.

“The 2017 HEI reminds us again that though we have made tremendous gains over the past decade, there is still much more work left for us to do. With some of our biggest battles still ahead of us, it is crucial that institutions continue to demonstrate that the march toward full equality is not slowing down,” said HRC President Chad Griffin. “The 590 participants in this year’s HEI continue this march in partnership with the LGBTQ community. For the past decade, the HEI has been the roadmap to closing the gap in ensuring equal care to LGBTQ patients and their families, and we urge every healthcare facility to join us in this continuing effort to provide inclusive care to all.”

The *Healthcare Equality Index* offers healthcare facilities unique and powerful resources designed to help provide equal care to a long-overlooked group of patients, as well as assistance in complying with regulatory requirements and access to high-quality staff training. The Department of Veterans Affairs Office of Health Equity coordinates facility participation in the Healthcare Equity Index. This office is responsible for championing equitable health for all Veterans including Veterans from LGBTQ communities.



We know military families have unique needs. If you are a Veteran and struggling with homelessness, we will work with you to develop a plan that meets you and your family's specific needs and get you quickly into permanent housing or prevent homelessness. We will work with you to find a solution and a home.

The Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) provides permanent housing for military veterans and their families. In addition to rapid placement into housing, the program provides eviction prevention, short-term rental subsidy, utility connection, furniture, transportation assistance and connection with veteran services and community resources.

FrontLine Service has been operating a Supportive Services for Veteran Families program since 2011. From 2013 – 2015 the program has served 968 households and less than 1 percent of those served have returned to homelessness. This program utilizes the Housing First Model, focusing on quickly regaining or establishing stability in permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis or homelessness. The program's intensive case management services and the ability to effectively connect individuals to community resources and VA supports has helped those served move quickly out of a shelter or living on the streets into permanent housing.

FrontLine partners with other Veteran service organizations to provide this critical program. We look forward to joining our partners in the near future to announce the end of homelessness for Veterans in Cuyahoga County.

Cold War Recognition Certificate: the Cold War Recognition Certificate is a recognition certificate awarded by the [Secretary of Defense](#) to all [U.S. Armed Forces](#) personnel and qualified federal government civilian personnel who faithfully and honorably served the United States anytime during the [Cold War](#) era, which is defined as September 2, 1945 to

December 26, 1991. Anyone who served in the military or the Federal Government during this period is authorized to receive the certificate.

Congress established the Cold War certificate in Section 1084 of the fiscal 1998 National Defense Authorization Act.
