1. 'Blue water' veterans bill clears Senate, heads to White House for final signature

The Senate unanimously passed legislation codifying presumptive disability benefits status for so called "blue water" Vietnam veterans on Wednesday, sending the bill to the White House to become law. The move came roughly six months after the measure was stalled in the Senate by parliamentary objections and just a week after the end of a legal battle surrounding the Vietnam veterans' benefits that has drug on for years. 2. 'A Black Eye' for the Purple Heart, as Groups Feud Over Funding - WSJ

The nation's oldest military honor, the Purple Heart, is in the crossfire of an unusual fight between military service organizations that could strand thousands of veterans who have relied on the groups to help manage their disability claims. The award, which dates to the American Revolution, has its own congressionally chartered service organization, which aids wounded troops and other veterans as they seek government benefits and medical care.

Anyone who served in the military or the Federal Government during this period is authorized to receive the certificate.
